David is from a family of Biscayne Bay sailors, going back to his grandparents. He started sailing himself in the late 1950's renting boats at Castle Harbor Sailboat Rentals with his father.

He bought his first sailboat, a Capri 25 in 1975, not knowing how to race. With apersonal commitment to succeed in the sport of sailboat racing, he learned from friends he met on the bay. With much determination he took the Capri to Abaco Race Week every summer and did not miss an opportunity to "go racing" or sailing in South Florida. In 1978 he pur-



chased **GOOMBAY II (J-27)** which he currently owns. And to add more sport and improve his racing skills he bought a Lightning in 1999.

David has become well know as a winner with Goombay II. He has won his Fleet's top honors twice in the Ocean Series and consistently is awarded 2^{nd} Overall in the Columbus Day Regatta. He tells everyone that "racing is in his blood, and he hopes it stays there for ever."

David served the Coconut Grove Sailing Club as Fleet Captain, was a member of the Board of Directors, and stepped in to serve as Rear Commodore during a difficult time in our Club's history. He represents our Club in Biscayne Bay Yacht Racing Association (BBYRA) and is 2002 Chairman of BBYRA's Executive Committee. He is also a member of Key West Race Week Consortium of handicappers. In 1997 he was elected to PHRF's Board of Handicappers and is their current President. He has a large dose of **VOLUNTEER SPIRIT** that we all need. Be sure to give him a "high five" when you see him on the dock or in the Grove's Nest Bar at the Club.

VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT

We have assigned an employee to incorporate these procedures and we are training him to assure that the procedures are followed. Bill is taking another look at screw down moorings in conjunction with high tech tethers. He has also provided written procedures for the hurricane hoist.




