COMMODORE’S REPORT

Another busy and perhaps pivotal year is coming to an end! It has been an honor to serve as your Commodore at this important time in the Club’s history. I hope you will agree with me that the Club is moving in a positive direction as reflected in the following events that occurred this year.

Tropical Storm Bonnie

Tropical Storm Bonnie popped up very quickly in late July of last year. In my absence officers Ron Rostorfer, Doug Hanks, Sean Connett and Ron Canizares made sure the Club was ready to evacuate the mooring field if necessary. Although we have not experienced a hurricane since 2006, I am confident the leadership and staff have well-established hurricane procedures in-place that will protect our club and member’s boats.

Main Dock repair

As a result of the age and condition of the dock, we began the permit process to completely replace it. It now appears we might receive the permit to construct a new dock as early as this fall. Ron Rostorfer, our Vice Commodore / incoming Commodore has really picked up the ball on this and other significant capital improvement projects that will be required in the coming years.

Instructional Programs

As a public service, CGSC’s youth and adult learn-to-sail programs are among the most important activities of the Club. Thanks to the continued efforts of our core team led by Rear Commodore Doug Hanks, and including our Waterfront Coordinator/Sailing Director Nick Mansbach, Adult Sailing Chair Richard Crisler, and seasoned instructor Bruce Penrod, we continue to see a significant increase in adult sailing program participation. This past year we also added several specialty classes– for Flying Scots and Cruising. Thanks to Bud Price for his commitment to the Flying Scot instruction and to Bruce Penrod, for developing the cruising courses. Thanks also to Antonio Bejarano and Laura Holz for working with Nick to keep our youth programs in top form.

CGSC Fleet

The CGSC increased our fleet of boats this year. Many thanks to all the members of the Coconut Grove Sailing Foundation for the donation of five opti’s for our youth sailing programs. In addition, with up-front financial assistance from Ron Canizares the Club purchased our third Ensign sailboat allowing us to further expand instructional and member-use programs. Thanks also to Bruce Penrod for taking on the job of getting our newly acquired 27 foot Beneteau ready for service in our Cruising classes.

Sailboat Racing

Hosting and managing regattas is another significant activity at the Club, and once again our Race Committee has outdone itself in terms of the quantity and quality of our events – with too many to list here. Thanks to Susan Walcutt our RC chair as well as Ron and Dottie Rostorfer who continue to give 110%, and Richard and Maryann Etkin are our Shore-side Activity Co-Chairs. New General Manager

Unfortunately our General Manager Dragan Savin moved on to a new job. However, with the hard work of Ron Rostorfer, Ron Canizares and Doug Hanks our current manager Pat Tully was quickly hired. Pat has been working with Chef Tara to improve our high quality menu, and also with Ron Rostorfer to better manage our limited parking.

Community Partnerships

Gaining momentum this year is our partnership with Ransom Everglades School and the Coconut Grove Rotary Club to maintain and enhance Island E. The cleanup and improvement activities are beginning to transform it into Coconut Grove’s newest waterfront park! Many thanks to Leslie Jones for coordinating CGSC and Rotary volunteers for island work days on the second Saturday of every month.

Strictly Sail Boat Show/ Coconut Grove Arts Festival

CGSC members participated in both the *Strictly Sail* Boat Show and the Coconut Grove Arts Festival in February, with booths and displays at both events. It was a spectacular weekend for the Club – with great exposure to the sailing community and the thousands at the Arts Festival. The many names and email addresses collected are now in our expanding data –base of “friends of the Coconut Grove Sailing Club”. Many thanks to Doug Hanks and Molly Welsh for organizing the Boat Show effort, and to Paul van Puffelin for organizing the Art Festival set up and volunteers.
