The next big event at the Club is the Finn Gold Cup which officially starts on January 24th and goes through the 31st. This will, perhaps, be the more prestigious event the club has hosted in recent memory with more than 70 competitors from 15 countries represented, international measurers and judges, international PROs, and more than 10 containers being shipped from overseas to get boats here on time for the regatta. All of this will be hosted on our grounds with spill-over into Myers Park to the north of us.

Bacardi Invitational Winter Series Event 1

December 17 and 18, 2022

Melges 24 and J70

View from the Pin Boat!

Happy Holidays to all! The weekend of December 17 and 18, was the beginning of the Bacardi series #1 for the Melges 24 and J70 fleets. A total of 38 boats raced in the first series, 18 Melges 24s and 20 J70s.

The predicted wind was 2-3 knots. Of course, as we all know, the weather person was wrong and we had an average of 8 knts and a West Northwest wind direction. Considering the predictions, the race committee and sailors were happy for an on-time start, 10:55, for race 1. The start rolled from Melges 24 fleet to the J70 fleet, and a 55 minute race was sailed, longer for the J 70s as the wind died.

What to do with the 2 hour wait for wind after race 1? We, as the Pin Boat, practiced pivot turns as docking practice! The CGSC race committee takes any opportunity to improve our skills!

Races 2 and 3 were sailed as the wind came in at 8-10 knots, with a more northerly and stable direction.

However, any wind direction with a westerly component is shifty, and it was no exception in the afternoon. Sunday, day 2, had excitement at the pin end of the starting line, with a J70 boat hung up on the anchor line inches from the bow, and in the same race, a Melges 24 "sailed off" with the weather mark, and on leg 2, a 40ft sailboat motored into the offset mark. Other than that, 3 races were sailed, with a total of 6 races. Results after the drop of a sailors worst score:
