

Flying Scots

Both Saturday racing clinics and Wednesday night racing are going strong through the summer. If you have ever wanted to find out what sailboat racing is like come and join us.

We leave the dock on Wednesday nights at 5:00 so you need to be here between 4:15 and 4:30 to be assigned a boat and get it into the water. It is free to anyone including non-members. The racing is very casual with the emphasis on showing new people the fun. It will run until the time changes.

If you can't make Wednesdays that early, give the Saturday clinics a try. You need to be here by 10:00am to be assigned a boat and get it in the water. The racing starts at 11:30 so you need time to sail out and find the start. This event is a little more formal with the emphasis on teaching the basic concepts and tactics of racing. It includes post-race debriefs and videos of the race with commentary and suggestions for performance improvement.

The cost is 65.00 per person unless you own a Scot or sponsor one. There discounts for those participants.


The next races are August 12 and 26, September 9 and 23.

SAILING LESSONS AT CGSC

Learn by doing--get out on the water with an instructor for private sailing lessons for 1 or 2 adults (years 14+)! 3-hour lessons on a club Flying Scot are customizable to the student's learning goals.





BASIC CRUISING COURSE AND CERTIFICATION

This course covers all concepts of sailing as well as basic boat systems, maneuvering under power, weather awareness, safety aspects and preparation, chart reading, navigation, and more. Most of the course will be on the boat with the third day reserved for practical skills and written test. **Prerequisite:** US Sailing Basic Keelboat Certification

BAREBOAT CRUISING CERTIFICATION

The course reviews basic cruising and considers planning an extended cruise, provisioning, power under difficult and emergency situations, anchoring for the night, advanced sail handling and trim, dinghy handling, and more.

Prerequisite: US Sailing Basic Cruising Certification.
