Policy Notice Regarding Animals

by the Club from its members, the Flag Officers (Commodore, Vice Commodore and Rear Commodore) and the Board of Directors deem it necessary to remind members of the Club's long-standing rule prohibiting pets from the second level of the club. Although signs to this effect are conspicuously posted on the stairs and elsewhere, some members nevertheless fail to follow the rule. Service Animals are the only animals permitted in the upstairs area, and no animal, whether a service animal or not, is permitted on any club furniture (i.e. bar stools, tables, chairs, etc.).

Emotional support animals are not "Service Animals" and are not permitted on the second floor ever. A person who falsely claims that their animal is a Service Animal is not only disrespectful to persons with actual disabilities, but also commits a misdemeanor in violation of Florida law. The Club has instructed staff to enforce this rule and persons who have been found to have violated such rule after being notified by the staff of such violation will be issued a written notice that will be provided to the Bridge and the Board. Please be respectful of the rule, and of staff or fellow members or who ask you to abide by the rule. We love your pets, but please keep them downstairs. Thank you.


VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT
