#### LEASE COMMITTEE REPORT

ello fellow CGSC Members. We are the Club's Long-Term Lease Committee and we have been working over the past several years to create various scenarios related to the Club seeking a lease renewal. The current lease term ends on June 30, 2026.

As a brief background, the Club leases the property (the upland and the bay bottom) from the City of Miami and for over 10 years (2000 to 2011) the Club was a month-to-month tenant of the City of Miami. This was until July 1, 2011 when the Club secured a written lease under then-Commodore Alyn Pruett. That lease was for an initial 5-year term (ending June 30, 2016) with two 5-year options (first one ending June 30, 2021 and second one ending June 30, 2026). Our goal is to obtain a significantly longer lease term that will allow the Club to secure its future as a community sailing center and doing all the great things that we do.

As part of our process, and with the help of professional consultants, we analyzed improvements that are, and may be, required so that we will be able to use the property in 20, 30, 50 or more years. These improvements include raising the seawall and working with the City to help prevent waterflow intrusion from Peacock Park and Meyers Park.

We also asked Club leadership to create teams of members to provide a vision of what the ideal CGSC could look like in the future. Those visions include more and varied classes with additional instructors and boats; more dock space; dedicated classroom space; larger kitchen; proper management offices and even a new building. These ideas (and what we've listed are just a sampling) may be implemented over a long-range future. We are now looking at initial cost estimates for all the improvements so we can figure out how we can pay for them over time. We know this is an important aspect because when we obtained the lease in 2011, the Club was required to spend money to redo the mooring field (at a cost approaching \$800,000 at that time). When other clubs on the bay have recently sought lease renewals, the City has required them to also spend significant money on various improvements (such as Miami Outboard Club committing to spending up to \$6 Million on improvements on a 25-year renewal). Now that we know what we must do, and what we want to do, together with the cost estimates and our borrowing capacity, we are preparing a presentation for the City administration to continue towards a lease renewal. We'll be reporting back to you as we achieve significant milestones.

## CGSC And Miami Yacht Club 2024 ILCA Olympic Trials February 17 - 24, 2024



It was a great honor and acknowledgement of the expertise of the Coconut Grove Sailing Club (CGSC) Race Committee to be invited by US Sailing and Miami Yacht Club (the host site) to support the 2024 Olympic trials for the ILCA 6 and 7 classes. Over the course of 8 days, the sailors battled in a variety of weather conditions in the Atlantic Ocean just off shore Miami Beach, Virginia Beach and Crandon Beach. Three circles were preplanned as options to accommodate the shifting winds, weather and current. Two trap course races were run each day. The event leadership team was comprised of US Sailing course management experts, former Olympic sailors and those who have a lifetime of commitment to the sport.

The CGSC RC supported setting the course from the Signal boat, at the windward and reach marks, gate and leeward mark and finish. Scores were transmitted in real time to keep the sailors, coaches and spectators informed of the event progress.

The winner of the ICLA 6 was Erika Reineke from Ft. Lauderdale, FL. As US Sailing mentioned, "she punched her ticket to the Paris 2024 Olympics" after 7 days of racing.

Ford McCann from Huston, Tx "achieved athlete selection and will represent Team USA pending country qualification in the ILCA 7". As our youth sailors know, representing the USA at the Olympics is life long journey. Erika shared that it has been a 15 year journey that has taken her all over the world! She was just elated!



So, the next time you see a youth sailor or you see a young sailor who needs a bit of encouragement, just remember that they too, may one day represent the United States at the Olympics! And where did they get their start?... perhaps they will say "Coconut Grove Sailing Club"! ## Bacardi VX1 & Viper #3 March 7-9, 2024

On March 7 to 9, the CGSC Race Committee ran races for 32 VX Ones, 22 Viper 640s, and 18 Snipes. It was all part of the Bacardi Invitational, which occurs during the last three days of the 6-day Star Class Bacardi Cup. The other Bacardi Invitational circle, not run by CGSC, featured Melges 24 and J/70 fleets. Altogether, there were 205 boats and over 600 sailors from 25 countries on Biscayne Bay for the combined events. The CGSC races were managed by Course Race Officer Shannon Bush and the Signal Boat was Lorenza Quijano's beautiful Solar Wind. On day 1 (March 7) of the Invitational, fleets were postponed ashore due to high winds and rain. When racing got underway, teams contended with squalls, a mix of rain and sunshine, and the breeze bouncing from 5-15 knots. In the Snipe fleet, Ernesto Rodriguez had a great start with two wins and a 2nd place finish. In the Viper 640 fleet, Marek and Chris Zaleski claimed a 1,5,1 to sit just one point ahead of reigning Viper 640 North American Champion Jimmy Praley. And in the VX one fleet, John Porter finished 6, 1 and 1 in 3 races to tie with Doug Clark, both of whom were 1 point ahead of Bacardi Champion Christopher Alexander. We had fantastic race conditions on day 2 (March

8). The usual shifty breeze was around 8-10 knots with plenty of race track nuances. All fleets got in 3 more races and earned a throwout of their worst race. John Porter held firm in the VX One fleet, Yoan Carrillo scored a 2-1-7 to take a narrow lead in the Snipe fleet, and Jimmy Praley took the lead in Viper 640 fleet after he was able to discard his 13th place Race 5 finish. Meanwhile, in the Star fleet, the day ended with our own Augie Diaz tied for first place with two other boats. Everything depended on day 3. The Final day of racing (March 9) kicked off with a building 12 knots of breeze and waves. Snipe Fleet: Going into the final race 8, Ernesto Rodriguez held a 3-point advantage over Yoan Carrillo and Enrique Quintero, who were on tiebreak with 16 points each. As with many of the other classes, it was open to any of them to switch podium positions. But it wasn't to be as Rodriguez/Uribe racked up their fourth race win and Yoan Carrillo was disqualified in the jury room.

Viper 640 Fleet: Marek Zaleski was leading the twenty-two boat fleet by 2 points going into the day, before a 5<sup>th</sup> in race 7 pushed him back to second, with Jimmy Praley now 1 point ahead. In an all or nothing final race, Zaleski finished 2nd to triumph overall. Mary Ewenson's 'Evil Hiss' team saved their best to last to take the win and escalate up to second, leaving the reigning North American Champion, Praley, to settle for third on tiebreaker.

**VX One:** Day 3 was a leaderboard shuffle for the top three teams. John Porter was the leader going into the day, but he relinquished the lead to Doug Clark after race 7. Defending Champion Christopher Alexander won the race and was poised to seal his

reputation and triumph again. Going into the final race 8, just 2 points separated the top three teams who were all guaranteed a spot on the podium. Another superb win from Alexander's team sealed their successful defense. 7 boats, including John Porter, dropped out of the final race, either because of or to avoid equipment damage in high winds.
