The Lightning Southern Circuit is six days of racing at two different regattas in a single week. The first venue is always St. Petersburg, and the second venue is Miami (in even years) or Savannah (in odd years). Since 2024 is an even year, Lightning Class boats raced in St. Petersburg from March 17 to 19, and then trailered their boats across Florida for three days of planned racing at CGSC from March 21 to 23.

But it was not to be. It was Robert Burns who wrote "The best laid schemes o' Mice an' Men gang aft agley". Loose translation: "Man plans, God laughs". Or, more specifically, "We don't control the weather".

On Day 1, Principal Race Officer Shannon Bush ran three good races for 20 Lightning Class Boats in Chamber of Commerce conditions on Biscayne Bay. That, however, turned out to be the whole regatta. On the morning of Day 2, after consulting with meteorologists and the Lightning Fleet, the last two days were cancelled due to broad and unavoidable swaths of rain, lightning and tornado warnings that were coming our way.



Based on one day of racing, the winners of the Lightning Midwinters were:

But that is not the end of the story. At the end of Day 2, the whole fleet gathered in the CGSC Great Room for a truly joyous and moving awards ceremony. This is a fleet which incorporates a lot of family values, and a lot of generations of Lightning sailors joined in for the awards. There were a number of special awards, including a Newcomer award, a Sportsmanship award, a Service award, and the "Middle of Biscayne Bay" award to the boat that most nearly finishes mid-fleet. All of the prize winners spoke, and there was a lot of caring and sharing.

And, oh, the awards for the full week of Racing were given out. First place for the 2024 Lightning Southern Circuit went to our own Augie Diaz, who is having a March for the ages. This was Augie's first Lightning tournament and he said, "I am still learning how to make the Lightning go fast, but this week it was just fast enough."

RS Fest comes to the US

Por 30 years, RS Sailing has used the latest design and technology to create modern, durable and fun dinghies, keelboats and catamarans. They are especially big in Europe, where RS festivals (known as RS Fest) routinely attract hundreds of sailors for a family-oriented regatta that combines racing with social events.

This year, on Saturday, Sunday and Monday of Easter Weekend, CGSC hosted the first ever major multi-class RS Sailing event in North America. The inaugural event attracted 47 boats and 66 sailors from 9 different countries (including India!). The premier fleets were the 22 Aero 7's (which are comparable to an ILCA 7) and 6 RS 21's (a keelboat that races with 2 to 4 crew), Other fleets were the Aero 5, Aero 6, and youth-oriented Feva and Tera. PRO Ian McClelland had quite a challenge juggling these 6 fleets with different racing characteristics. He solved it by having a single starting line with two different courses: a windward-leeward for the Feva's and the Tera's, and an outer trapezoid for the other 4 fleets. Over the course of three excellent days, he managed 11 races for the outer trap boats, 9 races for the Feva's, and 8 races for the Tera's.

And, impressively, CGSC Youth Michelle Perera and Anouk Theurillat came in 2nd and 3rd respectively in the Tera, class, despite missing the last day of racing to attend school!

And did I mention social activities? The Club was festooned with country flags and RS Sailing flags. There were three nightly dinners on the grass, a cornhole game, ping-pong, a boat hiking challenge (i.e., who can hike out the longest), a band, an Easter Egg hunt with valuable prizes, and a surprise visit by the Easter Bunny (who danced with all comers on a pink dance floor). All in all, a really fun atmosphere. This might be the start of something big!
